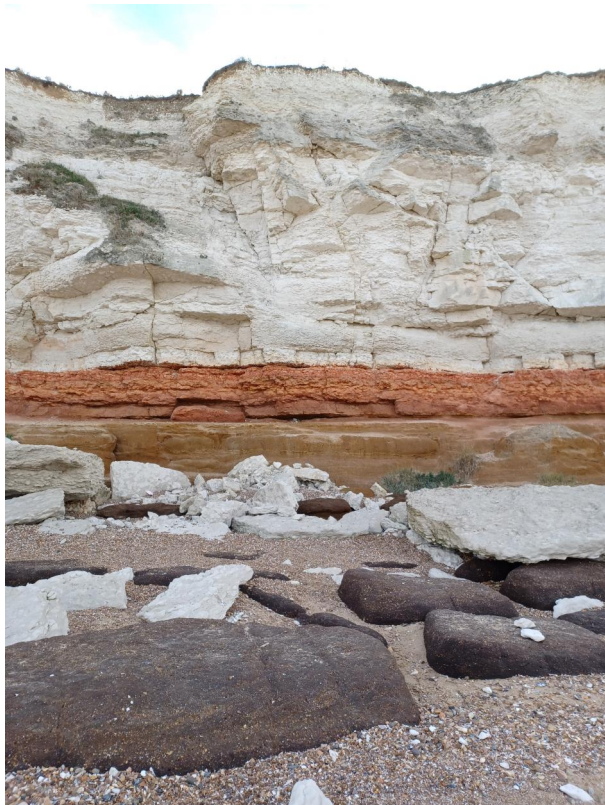

Whilst on the beach the students got the opportunity to carry out a range of fieldwork techniques, including groyne measurements, beach profiles and sediment analysis. We learnt how equipment was used, including clinometers, callipers and quadrats! Students then enjoyed some proper English Fish and Chips and a go on the penny arcades! ... and not a raindrop in sight!

## Chester House Trip



On Thursday June 22nd the History department led a KS3 reward trip to The Chester House Estate. This is known for its historical significance and rich archaeological heritage providing a unique setting for our students to explore the past. Under the guidance of experienced archaeologists and trained professionals, our students had the opportunity to actively engage with archaeological tasks as part of a live excavation. Students visited the ARC and saw the storage of thousands of artefacts and examined some of these with the latest technology.

During this trip, students engaged in various archaeological activities, such as field walking, documenting findings, and analysing artefacts. They learned about essential excavation techniques, record observations, and gained an insight into the processes involved in uncovering and interpreting historical remains.

This hands-on experience was fantastic and helped to foster critical thinking, problem-solving skills, and developed an appreciation for the value of preserving our cultural heritage. Our students were supported by the University of Leicester Archaeology and Ancient History department and our lead for the day - Graham was a wealth of knowledge and an inspiration to us.

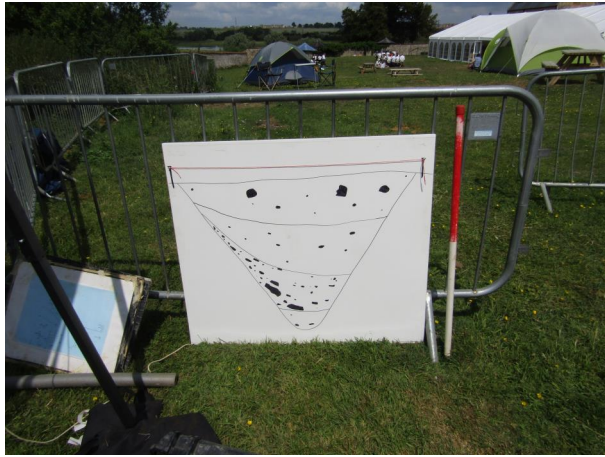

## UCAS Careers Fair

The UCAS Trip was run on January 20th to allow students to speak to representatives from most of the UK Universities to help them decide whether University is the right choice for them. There were 133 Universities with their representatives there for students to speak to. This will have been a fantastic opportunity for students to ask some important questions about the campus and the courses they wish to take. Some universities had demo stalls set up to show some of the activities the students will learn.

## **Geography**

We have had a busy year in geography, with students having the opportunity to learn topics including climate change, rainforests, deserts, megacities, slums and more! Lower school are currently working on fieldwork, which sees the year 7's and 8's conducting experiments around the school site. Year 7's will be exploring the best place to install a wind turbine and solar panel, whilst year 8's are investigating which site has the best environmental quality! We will use a range of equipment to achieve this, including anemometer, decibel sound measure, thermometer, compass, stopwatch and bubbles!

## **Music**

In **Years 7 and 8**, we have been looking at musical phrasings across several genres. They have been exploring this using the Keyboards and percussion instruments (and some other select instruments if they play them). They have also been gaining confidence in performing for others in the classroom. **Year 10 upwards** have been developing their own compositions and sharpening their recording skills. Many students across the years have been eager to play in the 'Summer's Here' Showcase.

## **Languages**

There has been a successful year for Languages at Wrenn. We have continued increasing numbers in KS4, taken students to exciting trips and continued promoting the importance of languages in the world of work. Students have shown much more confidence applying the language in lessons, showing a great ability to speak in the target language. We have also entered many students to several GCSE exams (Spanish, French, Polish, Russian, etc) as well as achieving great outcomes with our A- level students, who will be going to some of the most prestigious universities in the UK.

## **Extra-curricular**

Year 7 have had a fantastic year! It is clear from the achievement points that they have quickly learnt how to demonstrate the Wrenn Ethos. The growth and resilience that these children have shown this year is remarkable. Pupils have mastered archery, sailing and swimming. We have had a champion athlete, a black belt martial artist and pupils competing in the National Flag Football finals at Tottenham Hotspur! More importantly, we have built a community of trust and friendship; we are proud to look out for each other, we are proud to celebrate our achievements, we are truly Proud to be Wrenn!

### **Sports/P.E**

They have already hit the ground running and we wish them the very best in their new roles.

In May/June, we saw our Year 13s undertake their external A Level/BTEC examinations. They showed great determination and resilience throughout this period, and we look forward to celebrating with them in August when the results arrive. We were so pleased that after all their hard work, they were able to let their hair down at Prom on 28th June. It was a really enjoyable evening.

On June 20th, we took all our Year 12 students to a UCAS event in Bedford. Students were given the opportunity to expand their research into over 150 universities represented at the fair. This follows on from our internal UCAS launch in which all students were given advice on how to complete a UCAS application and the best approach to writing a personal statement.

On 10th and 11th July, we hosted a successful Induction programme in which we welcomed over 100 internal and external Year 11 students to 'taste' subjects they were interested in studying in 6th Form as well as to take part in team-building activities with our current Year 12 students. We look forward to celebrating with them also in August on Results Day.

Finally, we look forward to 6th Form Olympics on 17th July when we compete against the schools within and around the Wellingborough community in various sporting activities. Having not had Olympics since before the Covid-19 pandemic, we are really eager to show what we're made of and bring home that trophy!

### **6th Form**

We have had a very active and exciting year in 6th Form!

Throughout the year, our students have been actively involved in raising money for various charitable events, including 'Jeans for Genes', 'Sports Relief' and 'Children in Need'. In April, eight of our Year 12 students mustered up the courage and stamina to take on the Welsh 3000 Challenge, traversing 16 peaks in four days to raise money to create sensory rooms to support mental health within our school community. We are proud to say that we have raised £xxx this year for all these worthy causes.

Furthermore, our students have been demonstrating their leadership capabilities through our Give-Back programme which was launched in September. In addition to peer mentoring,

which has been part of our 6th Form culture for a while, we added the reading buddy, academic mentoring and after school club leader assistant programmes to ensure that students had a wide variety of opportunities to give back to the school community. They have done a fantastic job this year in their various roles. Furthermore, after a somewhat intense application and interview process, we recently appointed the following students to serve as Prefect for the academic year 2023/2024.

The **Hospitality** and Catering GCSE class provided the catering for the Christmas music concert, Designing and making all the food and drinks as well as serving on the night. Year 9 food students have been developing a variety of technical decorative techniques learning a variety of GCSE level skills.

**DT** students have produced some innovative and skilled outcomes for their projects in GCSE and A-Level, including mechanise from a special place and a device to store and move timber packs. In Art we have seen some amazing pieces, exploring portraiture and creative use of maps to convey meaning. In year 8 students had the chance to explore positive and negative space, including carving soap after studying Landscape art. Photography students have been examining techniques to enhance their images, including the use of mirrors and the effect of cracked glass. As always, we are so proud of our students and can't wait to see what they can achieve moving forward.

**Sociology** is always a whirlwind! We study real life so talk about events as they happen. As such, my year 13s watched the terrible breaking news that doctors were heading to the Queen and Liz Truss was going to see the King mere days apart. It is a privilege to share and study the importance of these key moments. Year 11 grew from strength to strength; it was amazing to see the confidence grow in them. True resilience! 55 year 10s have begun to tackle the subject and are bringing new opinion and passion. Year 12 have embraced the content heavy A-Level with vigour and we are looking forward to the new year to keep up the impetus.

In **Technology, Art and Design** this year we have been stretching and challenging students in a variety of areas. With students now allowed to use all the equipment we have on offer it has been lovely to see them exploring what we have.





**History** continues to be extremely relevant to our students. This year they have lived through the death of the longest reigning monarch, coronation of the new king and the year of three Prime Ministers. This links to our curriculum where we study monarchy and democracy over time. Some of our year 7 students were inspired by our unit on medieval castles and created some wonderful models - we clearly have some budding architects! We were also fortunate to have received a donation of original artefacts, including chain mail, a shield, a helmet and a sword, and a working model trebuchet.



**PSHEE** has gone from strength to strength this year; our curriculum programme is better than ever before, we've had amazing feedback from students who feel confident about the topics they're learning and we've developed assessment to help strengthen students understanding and progress. We've also been lucky enough to have external visitors, including The Soloman Theatre, Online Safety: Northampton West and the Exodus project: youth violence. These real-life experiences have all complemented the work we've done in the classroom.

These are some of the fantastic results students have achieved this year;

Year 7 - 63% of students scored 80% or higher in their last test; 95% achieved 60% or higher.

Year 8 - 75% of students scored 80% or higher in their last test; 96% achieved 60% or higher.

Year 9 - 74% of students scored 80% or higher in their last test; 92% achieved 60% or higher.

Year 10 - 75% of students scored 80% or higher in their last test; 96% achieved 60% or higher.

### ***"Tell me about yourself?"***

Students were able to ask questions and practice Job interviews. It sounds simple to tell someone why you think you would be good for the role, but there are actually so many things to think about, from how your body language comes across, are you dressed appropriately for the role and have you prepared for those all important questions which come in a variety of shapes and sizes. **Cast your minds back to your first ever job interview, of if you dare... the worst one**

We are hoping that this has prompted them into thinking more in depth about applying for a job and to consider other aspects such as:

- What do you know about the organisation? - Has the applicant thought about and are keenly interested in that specific company
- Explain a time where you found a simple solution to a complicated problem? - Can the individual problem solve and become an asset to the organisation.
- How are you when it comes to working in a team/solo? - Which environment will they work best in, will they be a suitable fit, can they work on initiative, can they think of examples of when these things happened.

In an interview setting, everyone dreads that "dear in the headlights" moment, so we would like our students to prepare for those situations, to reduce the likeliness of that happening.

Remember to do your best, great employers can see past nerves and they can also see someone who really is a good fit.

"It has allowed to understand what goes on at a nursery and it isn't just 'playing', it is actually very interesting."

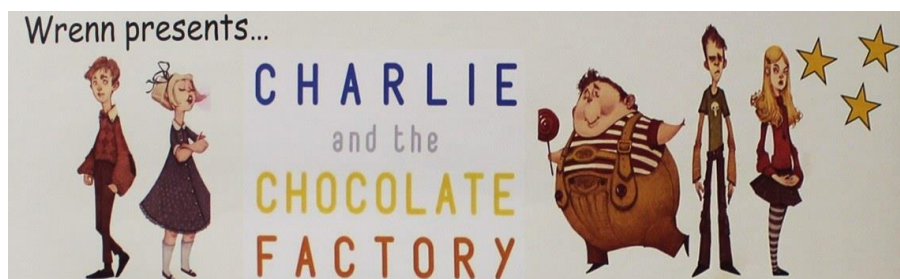
"boring, didn't learn anything" (This one made me chuckle... I think you'll find that you have learnt that you wouldn't want to work in that sector, not all career paths are the same).

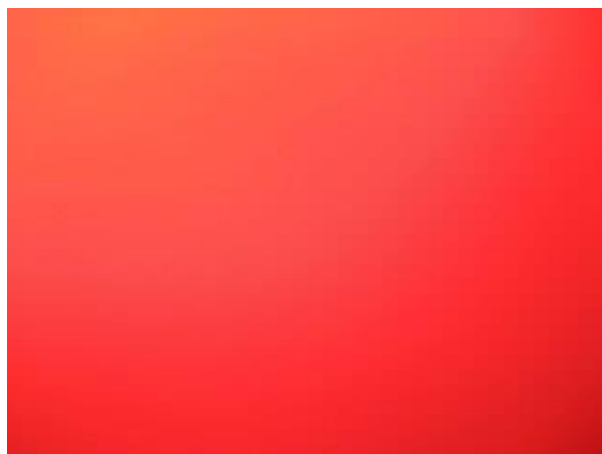
