Orchestra & Choir**



Cross-Trust Orchestra
Since 2021, the Creative Education Trust orchestra has been coached and conducted by experienced music teachers from across the Trust. Placing beginners next to more experienced musicians, for many it's a first experience of playing in an orchestra. During the four annual opportunities to rehearse together, performers are tasked with learning challenging music in a range of styles.

Cross-Trust Choir and Singing Ambassadors
Creative Education Trust's choir is coached and led by experts from Voices Foundation. There is a strong focus on vocal and choral development, with the choir working on repertoire specifically designed to stretch them. In 2022-23 this included folk songs from a number of different cultures, Seasons of Love from Rent, and Beethoven's Ode to Joy (in German).

The Singing Ambassadors are our soloists - one particularly skilled singer from each school, chosen by music teachers to receive additional tuition. They are given classical repertoire to rehearse and sing, often in a language they do not speak, and they are expected to perform with piano accompaniment as part of the end-of-year performance.



This talented performance was hosted at Abbeyfield School, for the benefit of all the students in the CET trust, and now you, the viewer.

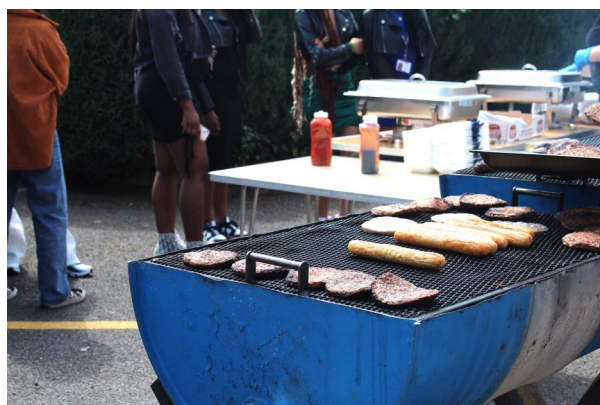

Careers Meetings

99% of our Year 12 students have now had their meetings with the Careers Advisor. We are now starting to invite our Year 10 students to come for their meetings, to get them thinking about their Post GCSE Options.

Barclays Life Skills - Year 10

Our year 10 students have now done their third Barclays Life Skills session. This time they went through Interview skills and tips for any future interview they may have. We were lucky enough to be joined by volunteers from Barclays who gave their thoughts and tips to our students.

Degree Apprenticeship Talk - Year 12

As part of our aim to give our Sixth Form students information about all future options, we were delighted to have Dale Willis come into our school to deliver a talk about Degree Apprenticeships, what they are, how to find them and how to apply to them.

Volkswagen Lunch and Learn - Years 12 and 13

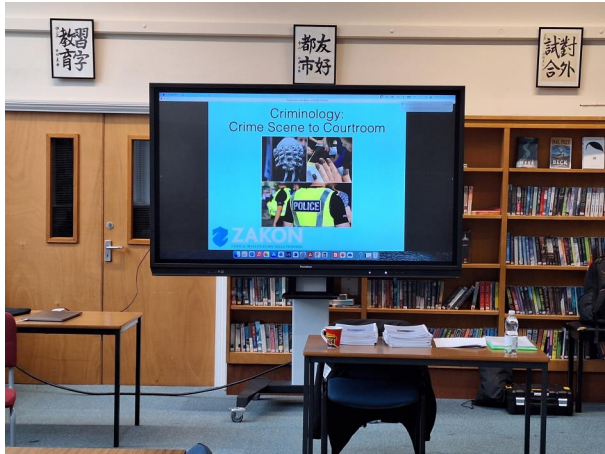
Our final Lunch and Learn session for this year was with Volkswagen. We were joined by 2 people who work at Volkswagen who had also gone through the Apprenticeship Programme, who came to give an outline of the industry and some information regarding their apprenticeship programme.

Northampton College Assembly - Year 10

We had a member of Northampton College in this term to speak to our Year 10 students about their Post GCSE options. We aim to give our students the information early so as to better prepare them for the decisions they will be facing next year.

Crime Scene to Courtroom Workshop- Year 10

23 of our Year 10 students got a chance to see a crime through from the initial 999 call, all the way to a Mock Court room. Students requested to be part of this workshop based on their interest in the industry. Our students were great, even getting the suspect cleared of murder during the mock trial.



Future First





We want to cater for all our students, so some of our year 9's had a [Future First](#) workshop, which benefited from a valuable visit from Wrenn's Alumni, to share their experience in their career paths.

Even for adults out there, picking a career path can be a minefield to navigate. Luckily, we have a huge range of former students that are more than happy to share their experience with our current students.

They covered subjects like:

- Is university right for me?
- Positions they held at their current work place
- Transferable skills

Our year 9's have now chosen their subject choices for next year, and only they (and maybe some involved family members) will know the reasons.

It's important to know that its never too late to change career, and most of the time, our skills can be transferable. One exercise the students took part in, was to sort the key skills involved in the day to day tasks of our Alumni, from most used to least used.

Students were able to pick their brains and ask some great questions.

If I was to pass on one of the most useful pieces of advice that I was given as a student, it would be to ***"find someone who does the job I want, and see what they did to get there"***.

It's not perfect, but it could be a starting point, or even a question you could ask your child if they are struggling. Who do they admire?

Picking your favourite subject is an obvious one, but those *extra transferable skills* could be key to landing a dream career. See what else you may need.

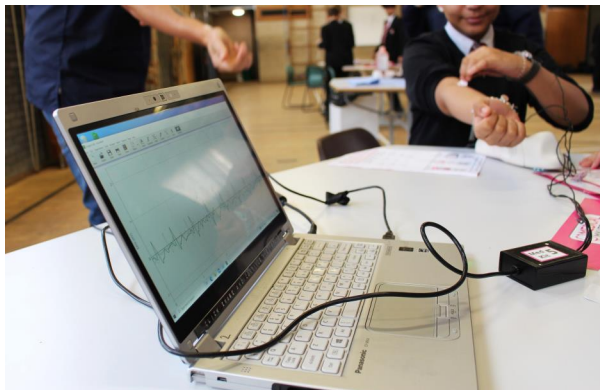

Year 8 Boys - County Basketball Championships

Congratulations for finishing in 3rd place! 🏆

Despite being up against some tough opposition, the students were resilient throughout the tournament, showing what it means to be a student at Wrenn.

They all received a bronze medal from Northants Sport for being the 3rd best school in the county!



County Flag Football

🏆 **Y9/10 Boys B team** finished joint 3rd in the county, recording a huge 28-0 win against Maplefields in the process.

🏆 **Y9/10 girls** finished second in the county (although the team they lost to are from Market Harborough, so I'm still counting them as county champions!) They now qualify to play in the **regional tournament in Leicester on 23rd May**.

🏆 **Y9/10 Boys A team** were undefeated all day, recording wins against NSB and Prince William along the way and showed a fantastic example of the Wrenn value 'Never Give Up' as they came from behind in the final to win it in the last minute. They have been crowned **county champions**, unfortunately for them there is no regional competition so the road stops there.

🏆 **Y8 mixed team** were also undefeated all day, winning all their games, only conceding 2 touch downs all day and scoring 72 points in the process, they are also **county champions**, they will progress to the regional tournament with the y9/10 girls.

Year 7 Fair

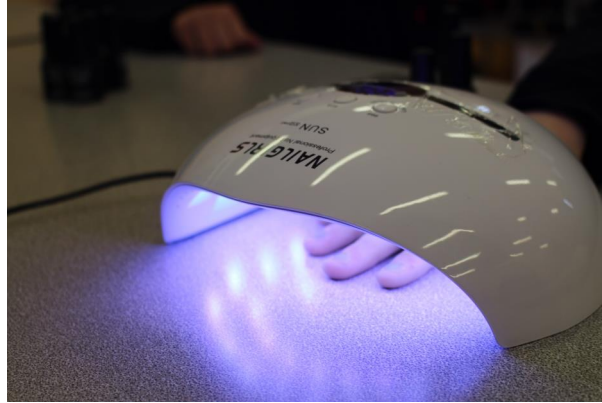
What a day!

Louisa Gregory - Sixth Form student, organised a **raffle**, along with prizes.

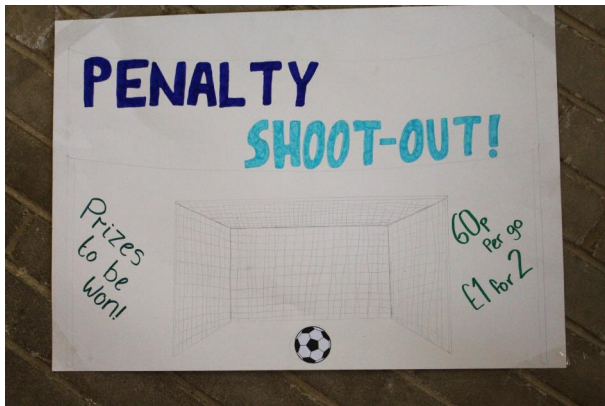
