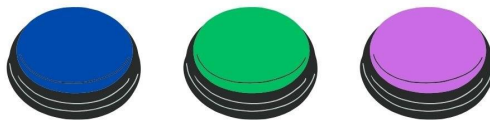

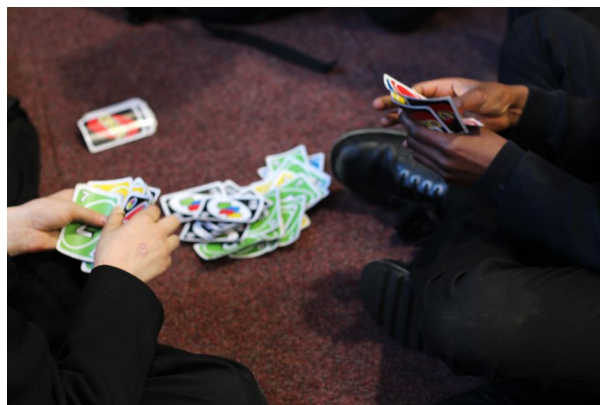
Mental Health Awareness Week

Our recent STEM on Track trip to **Hilton Locks** karting track was a fantastic success. A group of Year 9 and Sixth Form students, who have spent the year designing and building their own go-kart, finally had the opportunity to test it out on a real track. Their hard work paid off—the kart performed brilliantly and they were proud to hear it was one of the few fully functioning karts on the day.

After securing our lucky duck, the team took to the track with confidence, supported by our sponsors, KHRONE, who provided valuable technical guidance. Alongside the racing, students enjoyed a range of activities including inflatable axe throwing, STEM workshops, and exploring retro cars. Exploring the chilled food industry, learning about hygiene and the importance of effective hand washing.

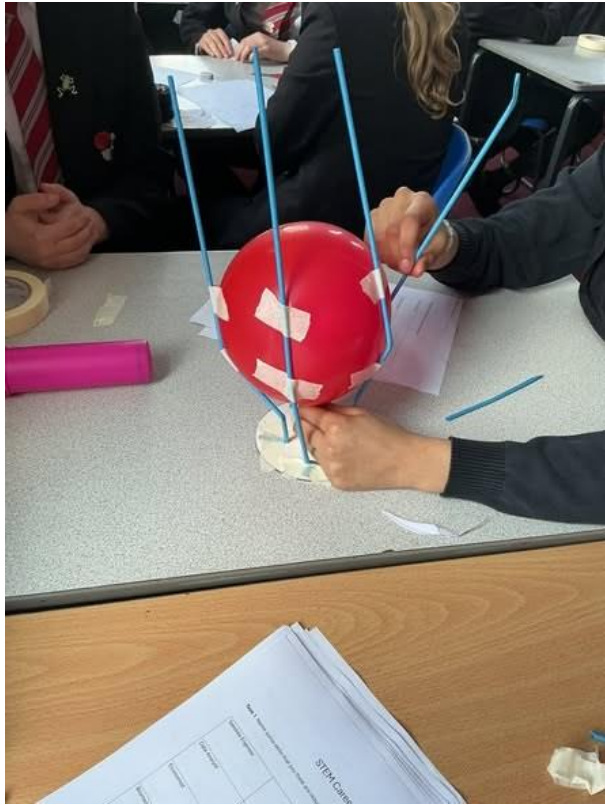
Taking on the role of forensic scientists to solve a mock murder using practical experiments

Careers Programme Update – A Busy and Exciting Term

Students also gained useful tips on body language, communication, and making a positive first impression.

The second session was based around **workplace behaviours**, helping students understand what employers expect in a professional environment. Topics included teamwork, communication, reliability, and maintaining a positive attitude at work. The session encouraged students to reflect on their own behaviours and consider how they can demonstrate professionalism in both part-time work and future careers.

These sessions provided our students with practical, real-world insights and have helped to build their confidence as they begin to think about their next steps beyond school. We are delighted to offer opportunities like this and thank Barclays for supporting our students in developing the skills they need for future success.
