Course summary	Psychology is the scientific study of mind and behaviour. In this engaging course, students will gain a broad grounding in aspects of theoretical psychology (including key concepts and studies) in addition to applying their knowledge to issues of relevance in contemporary society.	
What will students learn?	Year 12 Content	<p>Unit 1: Psychological Approaches and Applications: Approaches (Learning, Social, Cognitive and Biological). Issues of contemporary importance (aggression, gender, consumer behaviour).</p> <p>Unit 2: Conducting Psychological Research: Principles of scientific research and the research process, research methods, research proposals, conducting and reviewing a pilot study.</p>
	Year 13 Content	<p>Unit 3: Health Psychology: Definitions of health and ill health, research into health-related behaviour (theories and studies), stress, physiological (nicotine, alcohol), behavioural addiction (gambling, shopping), behavioural change (theories of persuasion, treatments, adherence).</p> <p>Unit 4/5/6/7 (one further unit) from: Criminal and Forensic Psychology, Promoting Children's Psychological Development, Introduction to Psychopathology, Applied Sport Psychology</p>
How will students be assessed?	<p>The course is assessed via a combination of formal examinations and ongoing assessment:</p> <p>In year 12: unit 1 is examined externally (this exam can be retaken) and unit 2 is assessed via three assignments.</p> <p>In year 13: unit 3 is examined externally and the optional unit is assessed via a number of assignments.</p> <p>Questions in examinations require application to scenarios and ask for a combination of short, medium and extended open style responses. Outcomes can be Distinction *, Distinction, Merit or Pass. These grades carry UCAS tariffs and have parity with traditional A Level grades.</p>	
Resources	Students will be issued with a course text book in years 12 and 13. Further in-house resources, past examination papers and suitable online materials will be made available to learners.
